In this session we will cover WHAT notetaking is all about, WHO our Notetakers are and HOW the notetaking process is managed. We will look into the strategies and technologies of notetaking and how they help to facilitate the deaf and hard of hearing students' success at NTID/RIT.

What is Notetaking? It is the recording of information that is talked about in class. It is requires the Notetaker to be clear and well organized in notetaking while providing a detailed account of the class lecture and discussions.

What makes a good Notetaker and who they are will be discussed in length. Generally, we look for a student in the class with a GPA of 3.0 and above. Other factors are taken into consideration as well.

In recent years we have made many changes to the process - from how services are requested to assigning notetakers and finally how students are provided with the notes. The transformation has been remarkable and we will share the technology that has helped with this change.

We hope you will come away with a good understanding of notetaking, what it is, the people who work as the notetakers and the methods used to provide the service.
