Graduate Council

- Graduate Council Vote Outcome
 - 13 in favor of the proposal
 - 1 against
 - 0 abstention
 - High number of votes favoring proposal

- History of Proposal through Grad Council
 - A previous proposal was reviewed last year by the Council under the title M.S. in Sustainability
 - Proposal received a positive vote
 - However vote outcome was not overwhelming in favor of the previous proposal
 - 3 main issues were raised last year:
 - > Title of Program
 - > CoLA resource impact concerns
 - > Absence of non-thesis option



- History of Proposal through Grad Council
 - Professor Paul Stiebitz and Dr. Nabil Nasr and GIS faculty readily responded to issues
 - GIS faculty worked diligently to address previous issues and concerns
 - GIS faculty showed strong desire in bringing program forward
 - Modified proposal was presented to Graduate Council on Thursday, Oct 22nd, 2009
 - Council members felt modified proposal more than satisfactorily addressed the major issues

- Grad Council Suggestions for The New Proposed Program
 - Dr. Christine Licata suggested to meet with Anne Wahl for input on Program Outcomes and Assessment Plan
 - Paul Stiebitz and Agamemnon Crassidis met with Anne Wahl on Oct 27th, 2009
 - Paul Stiebitz will cooperate inputs and suggestions into the proposal
 - Better definition of a "system"
 - Loss of Dr. Ryan Raffaelle impact on new proposed program

The New Proposed Program

- Fits in well with other "sustainable" type programs here at RIT with distinct differentiation
- Enhances RIT's reputation for Sustainability
- Provides additional marketing support further promoting Sustainability at RIT as a whole
- Program has outstanding leadership and program champions to ensure success
- Financial and student enrollment projections are attainable
- Graduate Council will monitor progress of program after 2-3 years
