### RIT TRUSTEE IS INC. MAGAZINE'S TOP ENTREPRENEUR FOR 2009

RIT alumnus and Board of Trustees member Kevin Surace is *Inc* magazine's Entrepreneur of the Year.

Surace, a 1985 electrical engineering technology graduate, is on the cover of the magazine's December issue. "Kevin Surace is on a Roll," the story proclaims. "His vision: To build the most innovative company ever, make billions of dollars, and save a complacent world from the perils of global warming. By selling windows and drywall, Kevin Surace just might pull it off."

Surace, president and CEO of Serious Materials, says the recognition came as a big surprise. "It's the Academy Award for growing companies," he commented. "It's truly a testament to the team that is behind me. And this kind of exposure helps raise awareness of what we're doing."

Serious Materials, headquartered in Sunnyvale, Calif., manufactures building materials designed to reduce energy usage and CO2 generation in buildings, which are responsible for an estimated 50 percent or more of greenhouse gasses.

"As a leader in clean technology, Kevin is in a position to make an important impact on the problems of global warming and resource conservation," says RIT President Bill Destler. "It's gratifying to see that his innovative approach in the area of sustainability is gaining much-deserved attention."

Surace credits his RIT education with providing a solid foundation for his entrepreneurial ventures. "RIT teaches you how to think, and how to think outside the box. And we put that thinking to work in innovative products and innovative companies that are willing to take risks. My solid education and experiences that I received at RIT have allowed me to take on the challenges of different fields as my career has evolved."

The *Inc* . magazine recognition marks the culmination of an extraordinary year for Surace and his company. The company's EcoRock drywall material was awarded *Popular Science* 's Green Tech Grand award, was named best new product by *Popular Mechanics* and received The Wall Street Journal's Technology Innovation award in the environmental category. The World Economic Forum announced that Serious Materials has been named to the 2010 class of Technology Pioneers. According to WEF, "The 26 companies selected as Technology Pioneers 2010 represent the most innovative start-ups from around the globe that will have a critical impact on the future of business and society."

RIT received high marks from the report card for its policy on green construction, as all new facilities built on campus need to be LEED certified, and the incorporation of sustainability into the university's latest strategic plan. ## RIT SEEKS TO IMPROVE HEALTH COMMUNICATION TO CREATE HEALTHIER COMMUNITIES

Most health-care experts agree that the communication and marketing of information on healthy lifestyles, current diseases and cures, and health care policy and delivery is central to strong community health and the efficient operation of the health care system as a whole.

In an effort to improve health communication and better inform the public on its role in the health care system, Rochester Institute of Technology hosted it's first Health Communication Symposium. The event, sponsored by RIT's Department of Communication, features leading scholars and community leaders in the field discussing the latest research and best practices in health communication. Rep. Eric Massa and Assemblymember Susan John will serve as keynote speakers for the event, discussing health communication, politics and public policy.

"Health communication is an extremely important but little understood component of the health care system," notes Tracy Worrell, assistant professor of communication at RIT and director of the symposium. "Through the discussion of research and current efforts in the development and use of health communication we hope to better understand its impact and enhance its use in improving public health."

The symposium also featured representatives from the Democrat and Chronicle, the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health and Rochester General Hospital discussing topics such as health reporting, health campaigns, health and wellness and occupational safety and health. It is not too late to hire an RIT student for a winter quarter block. If you are interested in a winter/spring co-op student they can start as late as January 2010. And remember that the spring recruiting season is right around the corner. Please consider RIT for all your recruiting needs, co-op, full time, and career fairs. Our goal is that your recruiting experience will be of the utmost success. We recommend that you post early for specific jobs and majors. Positions with vague job descriptions and listed for "all majors" won't attract as many students. Try to review the resumes as you receive them and make decisions on suitability. The market is very strong right now for students and sitting on a resume of a qualified student for even a couple of days could mean that you would lose the best candidate to another employer.

You are welcome to recruit at RIT any time, however, we find that the most beneficial times for employers is January 4th – February 5th. To make arrangements for On-Campus Interviewing, call Lynn McGahey at 585-475-5463. Lynn will assist in setting up your schedule. Interviews are usually in 30 minute blocks, but we can also customize your interview schedule to your specifications. Our facilities include a dozen employer interview rooms and our Employer Business Center – complete with internet hook up and phone access.
