**Academic Senate
Activity Summary Recap for AY2010-11**

SENATE ACTION ON POLICIES or FRAMEWORKS:

Academic Affairs Committee – Motions to be voted on:

- 1) *Policy D13.0 - The Provost names the Deans Council for CMS Degree Certifications (BS and MS) – Motion Carried 5/5/2011*
- 2) *Establish a Multidisciplinary Committee (same as ICC) and will be a standing committee of the senate, membership noted in Minutes of May 5, 2011 – Motion Carried 5/5/2011*
- 3) *Academic Senate moves that the executive committee craft a charge for the Academic Senate's consideration to constitute a task force on Teaching and Course Evaluation in 2011-12. It will be charged to review previous committee recommendations as well as all feedback received through the Academic Affairs survey, and to recommend a consistent university-wide process for student evaluation of courses and teaching that includes a set of core questions, reflects the appropriate use of technology and is based on best practice in the field. Motion carried 5/5/2011*
- 4) *The Provost's Office is charged to create a proposal (using no resources) that would address the structural issues around cross-disciplinary education. This proposal will be brought to Academic Senate for proper vetting (The Provost suggested this friendly amendment that that was accepted.)*

In the Fall it will propose to the Academic Senate any recommendations it has for further clarifying and strengthening its policies and procedures. Motion carried on May 12, 2011)

Policy E4.0 Proposed Revisions (Faculty Employment Policies) – Tabled 3/24/2011 and 4/14/2011; Approved with a friendly amendment 5/12/2011.

Policy E6.0.4 - Only a portion of E6.0.4 was approved 12/16/2010 per the committee structure to be a college-level committee, deleting department-based committee under section C. Promotion Committee). A new proposal per this policy was presented to senate by Andrew Phelps for discussion and vote on 1/20/2011 was tabled and returned to senate on 2/17/2011, and did not carry.

Here are the rest of the portions of Policy E6.0.4 voted for on 2/17/2011:

Policy E6.0.4 be amended to include a member (Full Professor) from another college on the promotion committee, consistent with tenure committees. (From E6.0.4, Approved 2/17/2011)

Move to have the same ad hoc committee assembled when having conflict to mirror the tenure ad hoc committee. (From E6.0.4, Approved 2/17/2011)

Propose language to ensure someone from the candidate’s home department is on the committee and each unit within the college is represented. (From E6.0.4, Defeated 2/17/2011)

Policy E9.0 (Visiting Scholar Policy) Motion to Table carried on May 12, 2011 and due to time constraints on May 19, 2011 will return to senate in Fall 2011.
