

It has been two weeks since the nomination of Clarence Thomas to the Supreme Court has been approved. The hearings which preceded the Senate vote have since become old news. Yet, despite the fact that Anita Hill is no longer under the harsh rays of the media spotlight, the controversies which were raised in the Thomas hearings will live on indefinitely.

Like many others, I am greatly upset by the Senate's blatant disregard for the seriousness of sexual harassment. With their verdict, the Senate discredited Hill's testimony, re-victimizing every casualty of this type of harassment. The male Senators judged an issue to which they could only relate from one perspective—the male one. And they decided that Anita Hill's accusations were not serious enough to affect the nomination of Thomas as Supreme Court justice.

Surely the Senators are not so ignorant that they do not realize the contradiction in ignoring professor Hill's allegations. A premise for siding against Hill was the idea that if she was being harassed, she would have reported Thomas for his actions. Why now will victims of sexual harassment come forward when the United States Senate has not given due address of the issue? Is the government so desperate that it must push aside closet skeletons to defend a major political candidate? If we can't expect exploitation of political lives from our government, what can we expect?

We are living in a society where

a man who has been accused of an action which completely contradicts the values on which his political career is based, has been given the power to interpret, as he sees fit, the laws which rule this country. Should we not be seriously questioning the moral and ethical character of this man? The election, the hearings, and the Senate vote were all done quickly, as if Clarence Thomas was the only young black conservative judge in the country. Was the government in such a hurry to fill Marshall's seat that it felt the need to rush through such an important process? It is disturbing to see that sexual harassment is a light enough allegation that it hardly registers on the political scale of unacceptability.

It is quite ironic that a man, whose nomination to the Supreme Court scared many women in this country, has already contributed to an infringement upon women's rights, before taking his seat on the Court. Pro-choice advocates dreaded the unavoidable possibility of a conservative Catholic replacing one of the Court's last democrat justices. As a supporter of choice, I feared losing the right to control my own body, a right which could more easily be stripped from me with Thomas on the Court. But now, a completely new issue has arisen. The 98% male United States Senate has limited the rights of every person who has been or will be the victim of sexual harassment. In almost every case, this person is female.

Like many other women, I have been sexually harassed. I did not file

any reports on my boss and I can not even remember if I told anyone about it. The harassment occurred for at least five months and upset me when I was at work, as well as when I was not. If I decided to come forward with these allegations would I have to prove myself to a panel of men who would more easily relate to the accused? To what extent would the fact that it has been six years since the incident occurred, blur the objective vision of those deciding my case?

It is obvious that Anita Hill gained nothing from her accusations. Regardless of the Senate's ruling, Hill could not have won the battle. By stepping forward, Professor Hill sacrificed her perfect public image. To much of this country she has become a perverted vindicator, dragging the seriousness of sexual harassment with her down the ladder of public respect. And that can not be undone. Due to his political prestige, Thomas was less damaged from the resulting publicity than was his accuser; his credibility was placed above hers. Hill's charges of sexual harassment were not significant enough to her male judges to effect the election of a justice to the United States Supreme Court. The Thomassupporting Senate has exemplified male bonding at its best.


