Inter-college Curriculum Committee Charge AY 2016-2017:

- 2. Revise Program Proposal Template endorsed by Academic Senate in Spring 2015-16.
- 3. Work with the Honor's program to revise Policy D1 to clearly outline curricular processes with regards to the Honor's program.
- 4. Work with Faculty Affairs to revise policy on discontinuance of academic programs (E20.0).

- 4. Regarding charge #2, in order to for ICC to craft the most appropriate and useful Program Proposal Template possible we met with:
 - a. Ross Koenig and Leanne Hill from the Office of Budget. We suggested and they were accepted some minor modifications the way the new budget model presents information and we believe that the current version should be easier for everyone to understand.

- b. Ed Lincoln and Diane Ellison from Enrollment Management so that we had the best understanding possible of the work enrollment management put into new program development. We came to the conclusion that RIT needs to get the information to program proposers that discussions with Enrollment Management before any other steps are taken in creating a Concept Paper due to the concerns about enrollment in programs. Additionally, suggestions were discussed of finding a way to plan for programs in future areas of interest, essentially is there a way to get and stay ahead of the curve. ICC had no recommendations in ways to accomplish that goal.
