Student Council Minutes  
February 4, 1946

The meeting was called to order at 4:10 by the President Bill Esch.

The church has been secured for the mixer, and Irwin Dixon will try to get an orchestra for it.

Another Handbook meeting will be this Tuesday, and the directory will be published about March 15, 1946.

A motion was made that the council members who have been absent for more than three times will be back on the council, and from now on, after three un-excused absences, and absentees will be dropped.

A motion was made that Don Soper will be the Student Council reporter for the Spring.

A motion was made that a temporary representative be elected from the new group of P. & P., to hold office for the rest of the year only.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:25.
