Student Council Minutes
February 11, 1946

The regular meeting of the Student Council was called to order at 4:15 by the President Bill Esch.

Ansel Brennen gave a report on school rings. There are approximately thirty orders and his wishes were that the representatives should still talk over the rings. The orders will be closed this Friday at 4:00. Oliver Khase has given a six-week limit on the work of the rings.

No orchestra has been obtained for the mixer, but the entertainment has been scheduled.

Bob Martin has asked for someone to take over the chairmanship of the student handbook. A motion was made that Dave Savage will be the chairman. Bob Martin will meet with him to carry out the same committees.

There was no specific information about new hassocks. The matter will be dropped.

Don Soper suggested that we get a new Alma Mater for the school. Motion made that there should be a new alma mater. There is to be a competition to be carried through the Sprit. The five best songs to be brought up in assembly, then voted upon. Mary Ryan will see Mr. Clements about such an assembly.

Herb Watt made a Red Cross report that \$22.50 had been turned in so far.

Mary Ryan commented upon the appearance of the halls in Eastman where smoking is allowed. The idea of a smoking room was dropped, because of last year's Council report, that there was no available space. Marion Spinks volunteered to see Dr. Ellingson about the smoking proposition. Signs will be put in halls to stop throwing butts on floors.

A question was raised about the yearbook appropriation. It is not clear just where the money is going. It was suggested that the editor of the yearbook be present at the next meeting to give his estimates.
