Student Council Minutes  
October 21, 1946

Student Council was called to order at 4:20 by Bob Martin, pres.

Ruby Jabo requested that the date bureau for the Dorm Formal be allowed to have a part in the mixer. A motion was made and approved for setting up a date bureau at the mixer.

Ray Baker made a report on the glee club. The club has a new director this year (Charles Warner) and is also participating in more affairs. The cost will be \$100.00 per month, \$60.00 for the director, \$30.00 for the pianist, and \$10.00 for music. This would make the total cost \$700.00 per year. A motion was made and seconded that council allot the glee club an extra \$350.00 making the total \$700.00. It was tentatively approved. Bob Goldstein made a report on the student mixer. The entertainment is to take place from 10:00 to 11:00. The band has been taken care of and the chaperons have accepted (Miss. Charles Peffetti has submitted the petition for the rifle club but the school does not have liability insurance to cover it. The coverage is to be looked into.

The election of the Photo Tech's must be done immediately. Don Deyle and Betty MacCargo volunteered to take this election. There is a form to use for election procedure.

An advisor for bowling has been found.

Mr. Mahony is going to contact Bob Martin about the school rings.

New business brought up was the proposal made by Mr. Christman that the students devote 1/2 hour a week on helping clean up the littered doorways and halls. The suggestion was rejected because as there would be no cooperation and they do not have the time. students

Wade Munsel suggested we further a campaign for recreational purposes. Airplane hangars can be purchased and erected for a low cost so it is being looked into.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:30.
