## Minutes Student Council Meeting April 26, 1948

Meeting called to order by President Lee Howick at 5;00p.m.

It was reported that the final figures for the collection held on campus for the Navajos Indians and CARE were 71.63 for the Navajos Indians and \$60.10 for CARE. The money for CARE packages is distributed to those people overseas whose names we recommend. We will obtain the names from the Rev. Calley.

It was announced that the Council for the year 1948-1949 will take over the meeting of May 17. It is important that elections for representatives to that Council be held in the very near future.

Motion mad e that the election clause from the revised Constitution be approved and that the future elections be conducted to comform to that ruling. The clause states that representation from the departments shall be as follows. 2 representatives from the ach of the Freshman, Junior and Senior Classes of the Art, Chemical, Retailing, Foods, Electrical and Mechanical Departments; 3 representatives from each of the Freshman and Senior Classes of the Photo Tech. and Publishing and Printing Departments. In departments operating on the block system each block shall have its own representatives as mentioned above. Seconded. Carried.

Russ Norris, Chairman of the Fencing Club spoke before the Council. He reported that the Fencing Club has only \$7.76 to complete the year. They are sponsoring a tournament which should continue for 5 more weeks. This would require an additional \$25.00. He requested of Council a grant of this additional \$25.00.

Motion made that \$25.00 be granted to the Fencing Club and that a note of warning accompany the money to the effect that in the future their budget be more accurately estimated. Seconded. Carried.

The annual banquet of the Council Discussed. Majority of the Council members are in favor of holding a banquet this year. Hal Burnett has volunteered his services to investigate prices for such an affair.

Motion made that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded. Carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:00 p.m.
