

STUDENT COUNCIL MINUTES  
January 3, 1949

The publication of these minutes is a new policy of Student Council, intended to enable the members of the Student Association to keep posted on the current issues being handled by their Student Council. These minutes will be published weekly and will be available at the Clark Union desk and other key positions throughout the school. If a broader interpretation is wanted, contact your student representative. A complete coverage of major issues will be published in Sprit.

The meeting was called to order at 5:13 P.M. by Pres. Ben Short. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

President Short announced that Mr. Killip, a representative from Bastian Brothers will be in the council office Wednesday, January 19, at 4:00 P.M. and at 7:00 P.M. to take orders for class rings and pins. Any R.I.T. student may purchase a ring with his class on it, whether he is a freshman, junior or senior.

The contract for snow removal from the parking lot has been signed for \$220 per year.

Due to some errors in the proofs of the Student directory it will be out not later than next week.

Miss Medden asked for help in selecting the best plan of hospitalization for R.I.T. There are several to consider. Phyllis Streeter volunteered.

Louis Gup asked how the plans for the dance club were coming along. Eugene Penler reported on this some time ago. There is to be an article in Sprit which will explain this. As yet, it has not been published in Sprit.

Someone asked if the Glee Club was active this year. As yet, there have not been enough interested to start a Glee Club.

The next student mixer sponsored by the Alumni Association is to be Friday, January 21. Council is looking for ideas or suggestions for the dance. Anyone having any ideas may contact Ben Short or Gene Penler in the council office any noon hour.

Louis Gup suggested that R.I.T. have a week-end similar to a Winter Carnival, Spring Week-end or Home Coming that other colleges have. Discussion followed. Due to a lack of campus facilities and dormitory accommodations the idea is very impractical. A snow spree was next suggested. At this time <sup>The Advisory Committee</sup> Council's main objective is the dance coming up in April. There is not enough money in Council to sponsor a snow spree. Other organizations in the school usually sponsor such an outing sometime during the year.

A meeting of the Class Advisory Committee will be held sometime this week or next.

Irv. Dolinsky reported that the department mail boxes in Clark Union are getting quite full. Mail is not picked up regularly by students. Irv. suggested that representatives from each department check the boxes at least once a week and list those people who have mail and post it on their department bulletin boards. Discussion followed.
