Student Council Minutes  
January 21, 1952

Pres. Jack Stumpf called the meeting to order at 5:10 P.M. The minutes of the previous meeting were read, corrected and approved.

Bill Reymen reported that the Student Parking Lot Committee is still putting stickers on illegally parked cars, but now most of the violators are local residents. The parking lot will have the snow removed for a charge of \$20 to \$30 per trip. Over-night parkers should park along the north and south sides of the lot to enable the plowing of the lot in case of snow. Nothing can be done about the holes in the parking lot until spring. Students are warned not to park in either of the faculty parking lots on Washington St.

The tentative date for the next blood drive will be March 5 or sometime after April 13.

All unused Student Association cards should be returned to Council office or to Miss Behr.

Phyllis Sprague, Lounge Chairman, introduced Dave Milbauer, who reported that Blue Boy Dairy will install a new milk machine in Clark Lounge immediately to sell either 1/3 qt. milk with 1/4¢ profit per bottle or 1/2 qt. milk for 1¢ profit per bottle. Discussion followed and Don Hosley moved that the 1/3 qt. milk machine should be installed in Clark Lounge. The motion was seconded and carried.

There was a continued discussion on raising Student Association fees from \$13 to \$25. The representatives of the Electrical, Mechanical, Detailing and Art Departments reported that their people are in favor of the rise. Joe McKenna moved that the Student Association fee be raised from \$13 to \$25, if possible, for the school year '52-'53. The motion was seconded and carried. The proposition now will be taken up with the administration.

Joe McKenna moved that the next meeting of Council should be canceled due to scheduled examinations. The motion was seconded and carried.

It was reported that Mr. Davis has been asked by Time magazine for a mailing list of R.I.T. students to be used for circulation purposes. Discussion followed and Bill Torow moved that Mr. Davis be informed that an address list of R.I.T. students be given Time magazine for circulation purposes. The motion was seconded and defeated.

Ordered school rings may be picked up at Council office Fri., January 25, at 4 and 7 P.M. Orders for new rings will be taken at Council office February 6, at 4 and 7 P.M.

Don Hosley moved that the meeting be adjourned. The motion was seconded and carried. The meeting was adjourned at 6:05 P.M.
