COMMITTEE

OLD BUSINESS
(SCHOOL BAND)

A request was made for the questionaires still to be submitted to be given to either Mike Schwartz or Mrs. Coaker in Clark Union. Discount tickets are now in the process of being submitted to local department stores for acceptance.

CLARK UNION
 SNACK BAR

Frank Kowalski presented a motion to Council that residual funds in the Snack Bar account be presented to Mrs. A. McDonald and Miss Isabel Brown in appreciation for the time they so generously have given the Student Assoc. over the past six years. The motion was passed.

COMMITTEE
 CONTINUITY

Student Council has gone on record that it was in favor of the recommendations made by the Constitution Committee regarding School wide elections. An Amendment to the motion was made and carried that two people from this year's Constitution Committee be carried over to next year's Committee without voting power on matters concerning school wide elections only.

A motion was made and carried that two members of this year's Social Committee to be chosen by the head of the Committee, be carried over to next year's Social Committee with voting power.

A question was raised as to the status of action taken on a Director of Student Activities for next year. No definite or decisive action has been taken as yet.

Explanation was given to Council as to the Student Union that will be in the new dormitory and to the moving of the Car Room to the new dormitory.

A motion was made and carried that Council purchase with money from the Surplus Fund, a new duplicating machine to be kept in the new dormitory, and to have a volunteer to check on prices with the bookstore. Mike Gotz volunteered for this responsibility.

A question was raised as to the \$1000 appropriation made for the Trophy Cases. No definite word could be given as yet.

A question was raised as to the function of the Executive Committee of Student Council . A recommendation was then made to amend the ByLaws of the Constitution to read that the Executive Committee consist of the President, Vice-President and Division heads of Council . According to Constitutional procedure, this matter will be voted upon next week.

It was announced that RedWing tickets will be on sale in the bookstore for \$.90. Also this Wednesday nite, May 8, R.I.T. versus Pottsdam at RedWing Stadium preceeding the Red Wing game. The tickets being sold in the bookstore, however, are not valid for this game.
