The motion was made, seconded and passed that the following division heads and assistants be approved by the Council: SQCIAL-Jim Humphrey and Larry Guzetta: STUDENT AFFAIRS- Don Rickert and Frank Kowalski; FINANCIAL & LEGISLATIVE-Bob Kohler, no assistant has been selected as yet: PUBLICATIONS & PUBLICITY- Dick Borghi and Frank Gubernat.
