The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Chair asked representatives to stand while speaking during debate of the meeting. The Chair also announced that Jim Howe is the new Parliamentarian of Student Council.

COMMITTEE REPORTS
(Student Affairs)

Art Pavelle, the assistant head of the Division of Student Affairs, announced that one hundred (100) parking lot stickers are remaining of the 100 which were available before the sale of two weeks ago. He explained it was necessary for us to sell these stickers because it is the student council's responsibility to pay the Administration \$5 for each parking space. Sale of the remaining stickers will be held on December 11, 1957 at NOON in Eastman 125. Pavelle recommended that following this sale, any remaining stickers be sold to freshmen for this year only.

Art Pavelle moved that Council give the division permission to sell parking lot stickers to freshmen, at December 18, at NOON only. This motion was seconded and carried.

(Financial &
Legislative)

Robert Kohler submitted an additional wrestling request for a proposed wrestling tournament and recommended that the requested \$ 215 be given to the wrestlers. It was moved by Marge Kellogg

and seconded that we accept this recommendation. The recommendation was accepted.

Kohler submitted the constitutions of the Skating Club, the Rifle Club and the Archery Club for Council's approval. In answer to a question, it was explained that by accepting an organization's constitution, we recognize the organization's right to function at RIT. It was moved that we accept the three constitutions as submitted. A member of council requested that Council be allowed to see copies of the constitutions. It was moved that voting on these constitutions be tabled until we have specific information as (advisor, number of members and activities of organization) about each organization. The motion was seconded. There was much discussion on the reason for submitting constitutions for Council's approval and on the question of how much we should know about an organization before approving their constitution. The previous question was moved, seconded and passed. The main motion was passed by a vote of 25-13.

It was moved and seconded that a copy of the constitution and/or resume of any new organization on Campus be submitted to each individual representative one week before voting on the constitution of the new organization. After considerable discussion, the previous question was moved, seconded and passed. The main motion was passed by a vote of 24-15.

It was moved by Art Pavelle and seconded by Gordy Price that Rho Tau and Chess Club be excluded from the previous motion in that the constitution and/or resume need not be submitted one week in advance. After discussion the previous question was moved, seconded and passed. The main motion was carried.

Elections of representatives will be held this week in the Commerce, Electrical and Mechanical departments to replace the representatives now on block.

Bob Barnes reported on the tape recorder. He stated that it is adaptable to our needs and could be purchased for \$193, including tax. Whether or not the council thinks it is in need of a recorder will have to be decided.
