Art Parelle presented the following points in favor of elections in the Fall: Study time should be in the Spring and not in the Fall: freshmen have the right to choose the people they want to have as their of items, with the nominations held the previous Spring. Ron Johnstone said that the social calendar is much too full in the Spring to allow the time for the elections at that time

It was moved by Don Lenhard to limit debate on the question of the time for elections for one more pround one more con ach for two minutes. The motion was seconded. It was suggested that we open the 'loor for cross debate. The president question moved, seconded and massed in minutes. The main motion to limit debate was defeated.

There were many comments and suggestions on the advantages and disadvantages of the various times to hold elections. On the question of whether or not the freshmen should vote, a number representatives of the freshmen class did not feel that

they were being harmed by not being allowed to vote. The provious question was moved seconded and passed. The main motion to have school-wide clastions held in the Spring was passed.

The President took the floor and stated that within a few years, the President will be a product of a political machine.
