DIVISION REPORTS

Social Division

The Council was reminded by Larry Guzetta, Division Head, that the Student Union at 90 Troup Street is open every day for the use and enjoyment of the student body.

Student Affairs

Art Pavelle reported that parking lot violation stickers have been given out today for the first time.

School rings ordered previously can be picked up on January 27, 1958, from 3-5 in the Men's Residence Hall and from 7-8 in Kate Gleason Hall.

Legislative and Financial

Bob Kohler apologized that his division could not work on the recommendation that Don Lenhard proposed two weeks ago with regard to a change in the Student Association constitution. Art Pavelle moved to wait until next week before discussing this recommendation. The motion was seconded and carried.

Bob Kohler read the semi-annual financial report from Dr. Partridge, the Student Association Treasurer. It was suggested that the financial report be duplicated and passed out to the members of Council next week.

OLD BUSINESS

The Chair announced the members of the committee which has been set up to investigate student government. Its chairman will be Bob Miller (Mechanical IV).

In view of an investigation conducted by Joe Zigadlo, it was moved that the President approach the Administration to see if we can obtain the parking lot behind the gym that has not been put to use by the faculty and staff. The motion was seconded and carried.

It was announced, in answer to a question, that the intra-mural trophies will be presented to the winning departmental teams by the administration.

It was moved that we give a vote of thanks to the REPORTER Staff for getting out the extra edition of the paper last Tuesday. The motion was amended to state that the President send a letter of thanks to the REPORTER staff. The motion and its amendment were seconded and passed.

NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made that the REPORTER be sent to students on work block. This motion was seconded. The motion was made to amend the original to add, if those students so ask for the service. The amendment to the motion was seconded, and defeated. The main motion was carried by a vote of 29-16.

Kappa Sigma Kappa took a collection for Father Flanigan's Boys' Town at the basketball game Friday night. This was most admirable, but this question is shall we allow all organizations to take up collections at basketball games. According to constitution, anyone who wants to solicit funds must do it through the Civic Affairs Committee of the Student Affairs Division. This question will be discussed next week.
