The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

DIVISION REPORTS

Social Division Larry Guzzetta reported that the attendance and reaction at the pep rally was good. There will be more rallies of this kind in the future.

There will be a meeting of the Inter-Organizational Council on February 18. The Election Board of Controls asks that there be no social events, opened or closed from April 21, 1958 to April 28, 1958, because of the campaign period for all-school elections.

Student Affairs Art Pavelle explained the fines for parking violations. The fine is \$5 and if it is not paid in one week, the fine is doubled. If it is not paid by the end of the second week, the student is suspended from classes until the fine is paid. The money that results from the collection of these fines belongs to the Student Association.

Art Pavelle again asked for volunteer workers for the World University Service Drive. Volunteers were Joan Cobb and Bob Miller.

Bob Kohler explained the blue folders in which copies of the Student Association Constitution were distributed. These folders and constitutions are to be returned before a representative goes on block or leaves Council for any reason. If it is not returned, the representative will not be allowed to attend the Student Council Banquet.

Bob Kohler read the Inter-Organizational Council's Book of Statutes. After much discussion of the technicalities and finer points of the Book, Art Pavelle moved that the Council approve the Book of Statutes with the recommendation that Inter-Organizational clarify Section IV, part 8 to read "annual open events". The motion was seconded. Bob Kohler moved to amend the motion to delete the word recommendation and insert the word stipulation. Since there was no second to the motion to amend, the motion was voided. The main motion was voted upon and carried.

In regard to a proposed Student Loan Fund, Bob Kohler reported that Dr. Bruce Partridge has said that it is not advisable for the Council to set up a loan fund.

1. A student can obtain a loan on his tuition, housing, or a large bill owed to the Institute.
2. A student can borrow small amounts in an emergency - the men from Mr. Bellknap the women from the directors of the Residence Hall.

There are legal aspects upon which the Council could not co-sign a note. There was a motion by Bob Miller to invite Dr. Partridge to speak before Council on this question next Monday evening. The motion was seconded and passed. The Secretary was requested to see Dr. Partridge about this. In addition, Bob LaTorre volunteered to compile information about loans and distribute this to the members of Council.

Old Business

A letter of apology has been sent to the University of Toronto.

At the Senate meeting with the General Education Department, the GE Department stated its willingness to deal with any complaints about curriculum, instructions, etc. These complaints may be aired to Mr. Clement and Mr. Fitzpatrick via each department's Senate representatives.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:15 p.m.
