Larry Guzzetta announced an Inter-Org meeting for February 18, 1958.

Legislative and Financial

Bob Kohler asked the members of Council to bring copies of their constitution to the next meeting so that the errors in it may be corrected

Dr. Bruce Partridge, Treasurer for the Student Association will speak to the Council at the next meeting regarding student loans. He will answer any questions which the members may have

Mike Schwartz gave a report of the National Student Associations conference in Albany. Art Gardner moved that the minutes of the NSA conference be submitted to the committee which is studying student government at RIT. The motion was seconded and passed.

OID BUSINESS (Cont'd)

Election Board of Control

Joe Zigadlo moved to recommend to the Board the rollowing: that elections be held on April 23, the assembly on April 22, with campaign week to begin on April 16, advertising starting on April 14, in order that the election campaign will not conflict with Spring Weekend and the IFC ISC weekend. There was considerable discussion as to changing the campaign week from Monday to Monday until Wednesday to Wednesday. The motion to recommend was passed.

The Board has defined advertising as "posters and other visual media," and campaigning as "any activity for the seeking of votes by a candidate or his campaign committees other than advertising."

It was recommended that campaign funds be alloted to each candidate by the Student Council in the amount of \$25 for each presidential candidate and \$15 for each vice-presidential candidate. This was so moved and seconded.

Joe Zigadlo explained that campaign aembers must submit to the Board a complete accounting of whatever monies are spent.

Mr. Belkhap questioned the allocation of money at all-It was suggested that all money spent, whether allocated or from the candidates own pocket, be accounted for.

There was much discussion on whether or not to allocate any money at all to candidates, and if so, how much, and should it be accounted for, if candidates can use money from their own pockets.

Mr. Belknap suggested that each candidate rally funda from his constitutents and backers.

The previous question was moved, seconded, and defeated.

It was moved to amend the motion to limit the amount of money to be given to the candidates.

There was a motion made to table the motion and the motion to amend. This was seconded, and carried by a vote of 28-15.

OLD BUSINESS (Cont d)

Election Board of Control

Jos Zigadlo reported that changes in campaign plans be submitted to the Secretary for the Student Association by noon of any specified day, to be discussed by the Election Board of Control at their daily meeting at 12:30 during the campaign period.

Candidates cannot advortise previous to the date set forth by the Election Board of Control.

All plans of candidates will be kept confidential by the Board.

It was moved by Mike Furman that the Election Board of Control outline what will be permitted and what will not be permitted during the election period. The motion was seconded.

Art Pavelle moved to amend the motion to state that the campaign managers will submit to the Board of Control general plans of the campaign. This was seconded and passed.

It was moved to amend the main motion to delete the words "what will be permitted." The motion to amend was accorded and messed. The ma motion was also passed.
