DIVISION REPORTS

Legislative and Financial

Art Gardner announced that letters have been sent to all organizations giving notice of their allocation and requesting that they keep financial records up to date in order that they might be re-examined on occasion by the budget committee. He also announced that for the first time copies of financial records will be kept at the Student Union. Next week all representatives will be given copies of the final budget.

SOCIAL DIVISION

Bud Lockwood announced that Student Council photos for Techmia will be taken Friday, December 12 at 3 o'clock in Clark Lounge. He also asked for suggestions from Council that might improve the annual Council Christmas coffee hour to be held, this year, on December 18 in Kate Gleason. Name tags for Council members were suggested as well as several ways - such as door prizes and small candy favors - of increasing attendance at such an affair.

It was announced that the Spring Weekend theme will be based on a series of "Storybook" titles.

Joe Zigadlo asked Council members to urge their constituents to support the coming Red Cross blood drive at R.I.T. Last year the response was poor so plans for the 1958 drive are being formulated upon a competitive basis.

He also announced that the Father Flanagan's Boys Town Drive has again been turned over to the Kappa Sigma Kappas who had administered it so well in the past.

The hours for sale of block stickers will be posted on all bulletin boards and all wishing stickers should be certain to bring their registration with them at these times. December 10 and December 9 in E-106 at noon times.

Student tickets to Lil Abner (now appearing at the Auditorium) are available at student rates upon presentation of Student Association cards at the box-office. This, is however, not good for Friday and Saturday nights or Saturday matinees.

At the request of Mr. Zigadlo, Bud Lockwood reported on the trip of R.I.T. representatives to McMasters University where they attended a social weekend sponsored by the National Federation of Canadian and American University students. The weekend included a pep rally, parades and tours of the University. Several suggestions to improve the R.I.T. social programs were made. The first of these suggestions will take the practice form of a pep rally to be held December 11. Other recommendations included a suggestion for a similar weekend at R.I.T. Suggestions concerning the parade will be passed on to the Spring Weekend committee.

Mr. Zigadlo announced that swimming is available for R.I.T. students Monday night from 7-9 at Monroe High.

President Finley reported that he had the feeling from talking to Administration sources that this would be done this year. He offered to check this week with Dwan Smith and report to Council.

NEW BUSINESS

John Markowski asked whether or not the used book store was going to be operated by the Service Sorority. He suggested the Executive Committee look into this since the bookstore is a needed student service with a \$100.00 allocation in this year's budget. Bud Lockwood asked about inaugurating a system of awards for those who work for Council during the year even though they are not members. A certificate similar to the ones

given by Techmila was suggested. Joe Zigadlo reported that this arrangement was being studied by Joe Burroughs, the present Awards Committee head.

President Finley reported that no memo had yet been received from the faculty committee that had been consulted about erecting a sign directing students to 90 Troup Street,

He also announced that the Administration would be unwilling to assume responsibility for the costs of printing the parking stickers since this was a student incurred expense.

Mr. Fram announced that the equipment for the additional telephones in Eastman Building is in and should be in operating condition within a few weeks.
