The meeting was called to order at 5:05 p.m. by President Schucknen. Roll call was taken. The minutes were read and approved.

A survey conducted by Council Representatives on the proposed Group Insurance Plan revealed that the majority of the students were indifferent to the plan. The final decision on the matter will be made at next week's meeting, after a more detailed description of the policy is given to Council.

Steve Tuttle, Chairman of the Lounge Committee, asked Council to decide whether the old television set from Clark Union should be given to the Electrical Department, the Men's Dorm, or to some children's home. After some discussion Bill Clarke moved that the television set be given to the Men's Dorm. The motion was seconded and carried.

Harris Rusitzky spoke to Council on the sale of tickets for Spring Weekend. Tickets may be purchased only in Clark Union and in the Book Store. No tickets will be sold at the dance. A personal contact program will conducted by Council members in order to boost the sale of tickets. Harris asked that, if possible, the results of the program be turned in before the Easter Holidays.

President Schuckman announced that "Mr. Campus" will be chosen in a different manner this year. Each Department will nominate one male senior member as a candidate. Mr. Campus will be chosen from these candidates the Friday night of Spring Weekend.

A report of the budget standing of the individual activities of March 1. 1953, was given by Granville Bentley.

Dick Anderson announced that the Spring Weekend formal will feature Johnny Long and his orchestra.

Bernard Boston reported that complaints have been registered concerning broken bottles in the parking lot. The problem will be referred to Jack Suilinski, Chairman of the Parking Lot Committee.

The selection of the recipient for the Rudner Award for the 1952-53 school year will be handled by the Senate Committee.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:45 p.m.
