

Rochester Institute of Technology
Student Council Minutes
March 30, 1953

The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Vice President Bentley. Roll call was taken. The minutes were read, corrected and approved.

An attendance report covering the period from September 3, 1952, to March 23, 1953, was read to Council members. Any representatives whose attendance fell below 60 per cent will be expected to explain their absences.

Mr. Brodie, faculty adviser for basketball, presented to Council a detailed report of the basketball team's expenditures for the 1952-53 school year.

At the next Council meeting Mr. Haerberg will represent the wrestling squad to present their case concerning their allotment from the Student Association budget. Council members are asked to have their questions ready.

Joan Bell informed Council that Convocation announcements must be ordered before April 20. Further information concerning the ordering of the announcements will be posted on departmental bulletin boards.

Mr. Belknap presented to Council a more detailed outline of the group insurance plan. Some of the major points are

I. Accidents

1. Covered up to \$500 for each accident
2. Items covered include x-rays, nurses, medicine, etc.

II. Illness

1. Hospitalization
 - a. 31 days for any one disability
 - b. \$8.00 per day for hospital room
 - c. x-rays, laboratory costs, etc. - up to \$40.00
 - d. Up to \$8.00 per day for private nurses
 - e. Surgical benefits - up to \$150.00
 - f. Consulting fees - up to \$20.00
2. Doctor's Fees
 - a. \$3.00 per visit beginning with the third visit
 - b. Maximum of \$75.00 for any one disability
 - c. \$10.00 for x-rays

Names of candidates for Mr. Campus should be given to the Spring Week End Committee before the Easter holidays; also, the polls conducted for ticket sales.

Bill Clarke announced that Spring Week End advertisements are being taken down soon after they are posted. Bill asked Council members to speak to the student body about the issue in an effort to keep the students from taking the signs down.

Granville Bentley announced that there will be a Senate Committee meeting Friday, April 10, from 12:30 to 1:00 p.m., in the Student Council Office.
