SENATE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
March 10, 1959

The meeting was called to order at 12 noon by Chairman Sal Schifano. The purpose of the meeting was to establish the rules and regulations to be used in the forthcoming Council elections.

Chairman Schifano reviewed the points we must consider that are set forth in the constitution.

1. Two lists must be submitted; one each for the president and vice-president. They must each contain at least two, and not more than five nominations.
2. There is to be a school wide assembly preceding elections.
3. A student association card must be presented when voting.
4. Absentee ballots are to be sent out.
5. A similar list for secretarial nominations must be submitted.
6. Nominees for president must be a full time or co-op student with a 2.5 average at the time of nomination. He must have one year's experience on Council or some commensurate experience.
7. Nominees for vice-president must be a full-time or co-op student with any grade point average and at least two quarters experience on Council.
8. Nominees for secretary must fulfil the same qualifications as vice-presidential nominees.
9. If a co-op student is nominated, conditions must be covered if he blocks out of town.

As the dates stated in the constitution are fluid, Sal tentatively proposed that our nominations be submitted by March 16, those entering by petition by March 20, campaign managers and committee managers and committee members by March 24, absentee ballots mailed by March 31, assembly held April 13 or 14, elections held April 14 or 15.

The dates were tentatively approved by the committee.

Sal then read the statutes for elections that were proposed by last year's board: A B and C

Sal listed specific duties for all the board members:

1. Obtain a list of all people in your department by year.
2. List all those scheduled to be in school on election day.
3. List all those scheduled to be on block on election day, including their immediate mailing address.
4. Bob Barnes will investigate the printing of absentee ballots.
5. Jim Carey is to investigate possible election rooms.
6. Bue Joyce will handle the assembly in conjunction with the Social Division of Student Council.
7. Gene DePrez will contact the Reporter
8. Raelle Wolf will see that a verification of nominees qualifications is recorded.

Meeting adjourned at 1 P.M.
