The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

President Boston expressed his desire that the student body do well this year in donating blood for the Red Cross and requested that everyone help the head of our Blood Drive, Jerry Shaia, in every way possible. The date of the first drive has been set for November 12.

Mr. Killip will again be in the Student Council Office, Clark Union, Monday, November 2, from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. and from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m., to take orders for rings. The delivery period for school rings was announced as approximately 8 weeks.

President Boston announced that some students had asked about the possibilities of forming a rifle team and a bowling team. Those students interested in forming such an organization or organizations should find out how many students would participate and then present a definite plan for organization to Student Council. No financial assistance could be granted this year, but they could be given consideration for another year.

Student Accident and Health Insurance was requested by 38.7 per cent of the students according to President Boston.

The disorder in the Student Parking Lot was discussed. A recommendation for marking out parking spaces was made.

President Boston called to Council's attention the perennial abuse of the Eastman Lounge. After Council's discussion of the matter, Ed Watson made a motion that some stirring publicity be given to the matter to make the students more aware of the situation; if conditions did not then improve, the lounge would be closed for a period of time. The motion was seconded by John Bailey and passed by the Council.
