DIVISION REPORTS

Leadership- John Beusch invited all Council members to attend the speech of Dr. Ralph Tyler on Thursday, Jan. 21st in E-125.

Publicity- Jim Brennan announced a meeting of all those who volunteered to police departmental bulletin boards,

Legislative and Financial- Joe Burroughs moved that the budget request forms and the approval of the Student Assoc. budgets be considered in the spring quarter preparatory to the fiscal year. Discussion followed and Jim Anerson moved that the motion be amended to state that Council should accept the recommendations unless a particular allocation is disputed by a specific organization. Additional discussion followed and Mr. Anderson withdrew his motion. The previous question was moved, voted upon and passed. The main motion was voted upon and passed.

Social- Fred Guevara took a straw poll to determine what bands would participate during spring weekend. The Kingston Trio and Les Elgart were favorites although Mr. Guevara emphasized that no arrangements have been made at this point.

Student Affairs- John Sturge congratulated the Assembly Committee for the work it did in connection with the recent appearance of the Rochester Civic Orchestra on campus.

Mr. Sturge also announced that due to the increasing problems in the parking lots Council members should be sure and warn their constituents that the restrictions will be getting tougher. Trespassers on student lots, according to

President Lloyd, can not be prosecuted.

Mr. Sturge distributed Red Cross Flood Drive donation slips and asked for the cooperation of students in this matter. Deadline for the slips is Jan. 28th.

NEW BUSINESS

Ron Senangetuk moved that Student Council allocate \$100.00 from the contingency fund to the Craft Club for an arts show to be held from Feb. 29 to March 4 in E-125. Discussion followed and Bob Moore suggested that since the money was not available from Council funds it might be obtained by using the resources of the assemblies fund. Fred Guevara moved to table the ~~and~~ motion. This was voted upon and passed. Council then voted upon and expressed 100% approval of this endeavor.

John O'Connor asked if some display could not be arranged in honor of National Negro History Week. John Beusch agreed to contact Mr. Strader concerning this.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:15 p.m.
