Student Council Meeting Minutes
February 15, 1960

DIVISION REPORTS

Legislative and Financial- Joe Burroughs announced that Techmila photos will be taken during the meeting next week.

Social - Fred Guevara announced that the Social Division may sponsor a dance before the next exam period.

Student Association- Vince Parks passed out appointment schedules for the Ebo mobile to senior representatives and asked that they remind those in their department of these appointments. He emphasized that any individual over 21 may still make an appointment and contribute blood. The final date is Weds. Feb. 17th.

Publicity- Joe Ferage announced a meeting Wednesday noon in A-211 of those who volunteered to keep departmental bulletin boards in order.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Summer Committee- Bill Ferguson presented a report from his committee that recommended a summer/committee be established of "B" block students. This was voiced in the form of a motion and was moved, voted upon and passed. It was emphasized that this committee has no power to legislate.

OLD BUSINESS

Discussion was held concerning the proposed judicial system. Additional minor suggestions were made and directed by Council into the body of the presentation.

In response to questions Fred Guevara explained the reasons for having this coming Spring Weekend a formal affair. He explained that "formal" dress does not mean formal, long dresses for women or a tux for men; but rather is a way designed to eliminate casual dress.

NEW BUSINESS

Jack Flackert moved that Council recommend that a student suspended from school for refusing to pay a parking fine be reinstated immediately until the legality of documents he has presented can be determined and his case is resolved. Discussion followed and the previous question was moved, voted upon and passed.
