The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

President Bernard Boston announced that Inter-Organization Council will be meeting January 12, at 7:30, in Room 100, Clark Union.

The subject of selling extra pictures from Technila was discussed, and Ed Watson made the motion to sell the pictures. Ed Krauss seconded the motion, and it was passed by Council.

In a discussion concerning the Technila staff's ideas to raise additional funds, Mr. Belknap stated that the original sum allotted by Council was sufficient to carry on the publication of Technila successfully. Herbert Winkleman made the motion that a letter by written to the editor of Technila telling him that any extra fund-raising activity for this issue of Technila is prohibited. There are sufficient funds to print the book already. Robert Nolan and Gus Fickteman seconded the motion, and it was passed by Council.

There was a question as to where the profit from selling Technila pictures will go. Ed Watson moved that his previous motion be rescinded,

and this one substituted: that Technila be granted to right to sell excess pictures with all proceeds to be returned to Student Council funds. Herbert Winkleman seconded the motion. It was passed by a majority of Council.

Robert Follmer brought up the old business of cafeteria prices and school spirit suggestions. President Boston and the special committees will investigate these matters.

The motion for adjournment was made at 6:00 p.m.
