Student Council Meeting Minutes
April 11, 1960

DIVISION REPORTS

Student Affairs - John Sturge explained the current shortage of parking stickers to Council members. After discussion Joe Burroughs moved that Council petition the administration to permit the Parking Committee to oversell stickers by 20%

The previous question was moved, voted upon and passed. The main motion was voted upon and defeated.

Senate- Jim Anderson explained that 687 students must vote in the coming election or the president and vice-president will be chosen on the floor of Council. He urged all representatives to get their constituents to vote. It was moved that it less than one third of the student body votes Council shall be bound to accept the present candidates. After discussion Les Greenberg amended the motion to include a provision that Council accept any write-in candidates if the candidate presents a petition of 100 signatures by the Monday following the election. The previous question was moved, voted upon and passed. The main motion was voted upon and passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Defense Fund - The Defense Fund presented a report and distributed collection envelopes to Council members for an individual solicitation of their classes.

Student Court - Bob Solomon announced that Mr. Sternesher will be the Court adviser.

OLD BUSINESS

President Lloyd reported that there were no objections from the administration to a campus wide freshman orientation and identification program. It was moved that Council institute such a program in connection with the annual freshmen daze. The previous question was moved, voted upon and passed. The main motion was passed in a 22-17 roll call vote. A committee was established to arrange such a program. Members are:
