COMMITTEE REPORTS

ALMA MATER CONTEST
COMMITTEE

The date of the contest was set for February 3rd. The contest will be jointly sponsored by the Alumni and Student Council. Approval of these plans was asked of Council.

It was moved and seconded that Council sponsor the Alma Mater contest. The motion was voted upon and passed.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

OLD BUSINESS

It was moved and seconded to remove the budget as approved by the Vice President, from the table. This was voted upon and passed.

Walter Haan was given speaking privileges. He represented The Masquers Guild and asked for a raise in its budget from \$336.00 to \$440.00. It was then moved and seconded to amend the proposed budget to read \$440.00 for the allocation to the Masquer's Guild. It was then moved and seconded to amend the amendment to give the Masquer's Guild \$440.00 with the stipulation that all receipts up to \$74.00 revert back to Student Council.

Objection to consideration of the amendment to the amendment was made, voted upon and sustained.

Then the primary amendment and its second were rescinded.

It was then moved and seconded that the proper allocation for R.I.T. Radio be changed from \$1700.00 to 0. Discussion followed. The previous question was moved, seconded, voted upon and carried. Then the amendment was voted upon and defeated.

It was moved and seconded to reduce R.I.T. Radio's allocation from \$1700.00 to \$1000.00. Discussion followed.

An objection to consideration of the amendment was made, voted upon and sustained.

The previous question was moved, seconded, voted upon and defeated.

It was moved and seconded to table the budget until the next meeting. The motion was voted upon and passed.

The constitution of the Young Democrats Club approved by Mr. Belknap, was presented for approval. It was moved, seconded to approve the constitution of the Young Democrats Club pending approval of its structure by the Organizational Affairs Division.

OLD BUSINESS (Cont'd)

It was moved and seconded to amend the motion by adding that the Club may not receive any funds from Student Council. Discussion followed. The amendment was voted upon and passed.

The previous question was moved, seconded voted upon and carried.

The main motion was voted upon. A division of the house was called for. The motion was carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:35 P.M.
