October 17, 1960

Members of Council met with Dr. Tyler, an educational consultant today and a report will be forthcoming.

OLD BUSINESS

With no objections from the floor, President John Beusch removed from the table, the motion to approve the budget.

Al Veza moved to limit debate on the motion to one half hour. The motion was seconded, voted upon and passed.

The total full time student enrollment was asked for and Mr. Mileur gave the number as 2,050.

Larry Albertson moved to amend the main motion by increasing Techmila's allocation by \$2200.00. This was seconded. The proposed amendment and its second were rescinded and it was moved and seconded to amend the main motion by allocating to Techmila any increase in Student Association income over \$42,900.

OLD BUSINESS (Cont'd)

The previous question was moved, seconded, voted upon and passed.

The proposed amendment was then voted upon and defeated.

NEW BUSINESS

It was moved and seconded to adopt the following two proposals.

WHO'S WHO AMONG STUDENTS IN AMERICAN COLLEGES
AND UNIVERSITIES

Proposal: That R.I.T nominate students for this year's publication. These nominations shall include the following, if they are eligible.

1. Officers and Division Heads of Student Council.
2. Editor in Chief and Managing Editor of the Reporter.
3. Editor of Chief and Associate Editor of Techmila.
4. Presidents of two Dorm Councils.
5. Several Presidents of Fraternities, Sororities, and other organizations. (to be chosen by above people)
6. Other nominations if time permits. (to be chosen by above people)

NEW BUSINESS (Cont'd)

Action must be taken quickly since nominations must be submitted by November 4, 1960.

Proposal: That Student Council set up a committee to plan a permanent method of selecting nominees for future years.

The previous question was moved, seconded, voted upon and passed. The motion was voted upon and carried.

The ring salesman will be at R.I.T. October 27th from 12-3:30 outside of E12.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:25 p.m.
