Student Council Meeting Minutes
November 7, 1960

The meeting was called to order at 5:10 P.M. by President John Beusch. Roll call was taken and the following were not present:

The minutes were approved as corrected.

DIVISION REPORTS

ORGANIZATIONAL AFFAIRS

Larry Albertson explained the procedure required for a new organization to be recognized as follows:

1. A constitution is written by the organization using samples of the long or short form constitutions obtained from the Division Head.
2. One copy is submitted to Mr. Belknap, who inspects it for conflicts with Institute policy.
3. One copy is submitted to the Organizational Affairs Division, who checks for the correct structure and form.

Council is concerned with these two questions-

1. Does Council want the organization on Campus?
2. What is the financial situation of the organization?

Larry Albertson urged that representatives make a bigger effort to report regularly to their departments.

SOCIAL DIVISION

Joe Farage reported that the Social Calendar Meeting will be on or about November 16th. Written notices will be sent to organizations this week.

Mr. Farage also stated that Student Association will sponsor a Winter Weekend this year.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

Jack Blackert announced that Andy DeMarco will be the new representative for the Business Administration Department.

A sample of the mimeographed report passed out to the Photo Dept. by their representatives was shown to Council members as a suggestion for reporting back to their constituents. The report consisted of an editorial and a report of a Council meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTSFOOD SERVICES

Doug Strait reported that the committee would like to have a contest to name the snack bar, and also they would like to have pictures hung around the snack bar-i.e. RIT athletes' pictures. He then moved that the Food Services Committee organize and conduct a contest to name the snack bar. This was voted upon and passed.

A request was made for 2 students on the board plan to be on the committee.

N.S.A.

Don Lembeck explained the purpose of the Election Day Project, which is to demand that civil rights action be first on the agenda of the party that is elected.

He then moved "Student Council give its approval to the N.S.A. recommended Election Day Demonstrations, and to the R.I.T. students who are staging a demonstration tomorrow evening (November 8) from 4-6 P.M. at election headquarters of the Democrats and Republicans."

The previous question was moved, voted upon and passed.

The main motion was voted upon and defeated.

Doug Strait moved that Student Council representatives explain to their constituents the essence of the Election Day Project tomorrow morning before the scheduled project. The previous question was moved, voted upon and passed. The main motion was voted upon and defeated.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

John Beusch asked for volunteers for these 2 committees -

1. A committee to consider used books at the Student Union.
2. A committee for "Who's Who in America Colleges and Universities."

OLD BUSINESS

A report will be given next week concerning the use of the gym by students who have their own equipment.

NEW BUSINESS

It was moved that Council accept the Constitution and By Laws after one reading. This was voted upon and passed.
