DIVISION REPORTS

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

A request for additional funds was made to the Budget Committee for Spring Weekend by the Social Division. The committee recommended that the Social Division be allocated an additional \$1500.00. Jack Blackert stated that the money would come from the contingency fund which is approximately \$2400.00 now. He then moved that Council accept the recommendation of the Budget Committee to allocate \$1500.00 more to the Social Division. This was voted upon and passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

NATIONAL STUDENTS
ASSOCIATION

Bruce Fredericks made an announcement concerning two conferences to which R.I.T. may send representatives.

One is a conference to discuss "What the Northern Student Can Do About Intergration" at Cornell University, on December 2 and 3rd, sponsored by the Cornell Committee Against Segregation. The other Conference is the Penta-Regional which will be held the week of February 15 to discuss campus problems.

FOOD SERVICES

Recommendations for prizes to be given to the winner of the Snack Bar naming contest were given to the Administration.

Tuesday noon, the Snack Bar will serve a turkey lunch at a reduced rate, and Tuesday night a Thanksgiving dinner will be served.

Bob Moore and Andy DeMarco volunteered to replace Bill Halldow and Doug Strait on Food Services Committee during the winter quarter.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

John Beuseh reminded Council that Dr. M. Ellingson will be at the November 28th meeting of Council for a Question and Answer period.

OLD BUSINESS

The Student Loan Fund proposals have been formulated and will be mimeographed and presented to Council at the next meeting.

Charles Decker reported that the Student Handbook and Directory is not printed as yet due to the fact that an instructor refused to allow the use of the Printing Department's facilities for the printing. More inquiries will be made into this before the alternative of having the job done on the outside of the Institute is taken.

NEW BUSINESS

Jack Blackert moved that Student Council grant permission to W.R.I.T. to use rooms 3, 4, and 5 on the second floor of the Student Union for offices and studios. Walt Haan explained W.R.I.T. would use 1 room for broadcasting, 1 room for taping future programs and 1 room for offices. A question was raised as to whether any additional electrical wiring was needed for the stations operation at the Student Union, and what the cost would be, if any. Al Vezza then moved to amend the main motion by stating "Council accept this proposal by giving the authority to an investigating committee for final approval." The amendment was voted upon and passed. The main motion as amended was voted upon and passed. The members of the investigating committee are: Al Vezza, Doug Strait and Marlin Siegwalt.

NEW BUSINESS (Cont'd)

Al Sheppard, president of the Hockey Club asked Council to set up a committee to investigate the problem the Club has been having in getting the ice skating rink for practice. He stated he has presented a feasible plan for protecting the rink walls from damage from hockey practice to Mr. Elkin, but up to date has met with no success.

It was then moved that Council establish a committee to investigate the hockey club situation.

The motion was voted upon and passed.
