PARKING LOT

A representative showed a movie to Student Council concerning "Parkos", which demonstrated a new system for solving parking. Bud Rusitsky moved that we adopt the electronic gate. The motion was seconded and discussion followed. The approximate cost of a single gate would be about \$1300. Frank Kowalski tabled the motion until the next meeting.

PUBLICATIONS

Rod Brower reported that the proof reading has been completed on the Student Directory. No definite date has been set for the distribution of the directory. Activity cards will be distributed the next block for the benefit of those not in school at the present time.

LOUNGE

Robert Seabrooks reported that the new clock, which has a bell, has been purchased for the new snack bar by the Administration. Friday, November 18, 1955, the new Hi-Fi set will be presented by Student Christian Fellowship at the Presbyterian Church to Bob Seabrooks. A report will be presented next meeting concerning the vending machines and it was suggested that someone else take care of the money in the ccke machine as it has not been properly taken care of in the past.

ASSEMBLY

Robert Ball reported that there will be another assembly on December 8th. It is "The Review in Blue" given by a group from Sampson Air Force Base.

ATHLETIC AWARDS

Fred Steinbeck still has to present the matter of awards and of major and minor sports to the Athletic Board of Control and then present it to Student Council.

Art Borock reports that the present program is outmoded and hopes some revisions will be made. He will report at the next meeting.

BUDGET

The following budget requests and suggested allocations were explained by Frank Kowalski and discussion was held.

- a) Since the Dance Club has no definite needs listed for their budget request, a representative must come before Student Council to explain why they would need \$50.00.
- b) The difference in cost, in the Clark Union budget concerns the maintenance. Clark Union is used by many various groups and not just by the men living in the dorm.
- c) The budget for Techmila is approximately the cost of the book without the cost of the printing being included.
- d) So few girls have been coming to the girls' chorus that the Budget Committee suggested to Dr. Kaufman that it be dropped and have the mixed group two nights and the boys' chorus on the other.
- e) The Tennis budget was postponed until the mid-year when more definite information may be obtained.

Bud Rusitzky moved that the suggested budgets be accepted. The motion was seconded and carried.

TECHMILA

The discussion on subscribing to Techmila was tabled until next meeting. A representative from Techmila will report to Student Council to give data concerning the book.

The motion for adjournment was made and seconded, and the meeting was adjourned at 6:30 p.m.
