DIVISION REPORTS

CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

Fred Babcock reported that Mr. Rider looked at the hold in the parking lot and decided it was on city property and will have to be fixed by them.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

Jack Blackert reported the Chess Club made a request for additional funds of \$50.00. Jack Blackert moved that this additional allocation to the Chess Club be refused. The motion was voted upon and passed.

Jack also reported the R.I.T. Bowling League requested \$36.00 to enter the Invitational Bowling Tournament at Utica College. Larry Albertson moved to grant the allocation of \$36.00 to the Bowling League. The motion was voted upon and passed. In response to questions about WRIT, Jack stated they have spent \$600.00 of \$1700.00 allocated as of January 31, 1961. Charles Decker will get a report from the WRIT as to the present status.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

ELECTION BOARD OF  
CONTROLS

Dan McGillicuddy reported that candidate petitions are available in all department offices and are due March 27th. Candidates receiving funds from Council will be required to submit a budget. It was then moved to delete Article VII, section 3, part b of the By-Laws of Student Council which reads:

## ELECTION BOARD OF CONTROLS (CONT'D)

"At the same meeting as the lists of nominees are submitted, Student Council shall discuss and approve the lists. These lists shall not exceed five nominations for President and five nominations for Vice-President." The motion was voted upon and passed.

Dan asked for suggestions for Presidential and Vice-Presidential candidates.

## ALMA MATER CONTEST

The new date for the Alma Mater contest is April 17th and one prize of \$75.00 will be offered. It was moved that Council accept additional entries to the Alma Mater contest. The motion was voted upon and passed.

## ASSEMBLIES

Bob Moore reported that Mr. Morris, an Israeli representative will speak at an assembly, March 29, 1961 at 11:00 A.M.

## N.S.A.

Bruce Fredericks announced a New York Regional Conference at Alfred to which R.I.T. may send representatives. Bruce pointed out that the N.S.A. does not govern Student Council, but it is a service organization.

## TECHMILA

Andy DeMarco reported the Admission Office will not pay \$2.00 per copy, but if Council would set another price, they would consider it. Jim Anderson moved that Council sell the yearbook for \$1.99 each, It was then moved to amend the motion to read \$1.00 instead of \$1.99. The amendment was voted upon and a tie resulted. The President then broke the tie in favor of the amendment. The main motion was voted upon and a tie resulted. The President broke the tie against the motion. John Beusch will talk to Dr. Bush concerning this matter. George Murray moved that for whatever price the Techmilas are sold to the Administration that the students have the opportunity to buy at the same price before the Administration. The motion was voted upon and passed.

## WHO'S WHO ETC.

Dan McGillicuddy reported the point system in choosing nominations for "Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities" will be abolished.

## ANNOUNCEMENTS

## NEW BUSINESS
