FOOD SERVICES
COMMITTEE

Bob Moore reported the Food Services Committee has been inactive for the past few weeks due to lack of attendance. Bob stated that no action has been taken on suggestions submitted by the Council members of the Committee. OLD BUSINESS

Dave Egan moved to rescind the motion which states that for whatever the Techmilas are sold to the Administration that the students have the opportunity to buy them at the same price before the Administration. The motion was voted upon and defeated. The Techmilas will be offered to the student for sale before April 22nd when the Administration will need them.

NEW BUSINESS

Jack Blackert moved that \$55.00 be allocated to the Modern Jazz Society. Arnie Doren, president of the Modern Jazz Society told the Council the money will be used to help pay for the Eastman Percussion Group which will play at the Art Festival, May 20 and 21. The motion was voted upon and passed.

John Beusch asked for volunteers for two committees. Volunteers for a committee to investigate the possibility of a Parents Weekend are: Dave Egan, Bruce Fredericks, Dan McGillicuddy.

There were no volunteers for the committee to investigate the possibility of a school-wide Honorary Society and recognition for those graduating with honors. John Beusch will start the investigation.

There are ten vacancies on Council this Spring Quarter. Bob Moore moved that the representatives elected in 2 weeks shall fill the vacancies, if any, in that department, for the remainder of the year. The motion was voted upon and passed. John Beusch stated this motion suspends the pertinent part of the constitution for this year.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:05.
