The minutes of the previous meeting were read
corrected, and approved.

CARNEGIE MUSIC
ROOM EQUIPMENT

Dick Osborne, chairman of the Carnegie Music
Room, presented a list of expenditures for new
equipment made by the Carnegie music room and re-
commended by last year's Council to come out of their
surplus funds. These expenditures are as follows:

The chairman asked that these expenditures
be approved by Council. Robert Ball made the motion
and it was seconded that Council appropriate this
money. Discussion followed and it was made clear
that this money was to come from last year's
surplus funds. The motion was carried.

PUBLICATIONS

Rod Brower reported that the final cost of the student directory is \$939.32. As Council previously voted on a total of \$925.00, it was suggested that the extra \$14.32 be taken from next year's budget for the student handbook. The motion was made and seconded that Council pay the full cost of the directory out of this year's funds. The motion was carried.

Rod announced that arrangements will be made for re-tailing students on A block to pick up their student activity cards in Clark Union during the coming week.

COFFEE HOUR

Carl Nelson reminded Council of the coffee hour, Tuesday, January 31 from 3-5 p.m in the Eastman Assembly Hall. The President asked that Council members be prepared to answer the questions of their fellow students.

As the Ski Club's constitution was approved last week President Mort presented a request from the club for money to finance their trip this weekend. It is as follows:

Discussion was carried on regarding the policy of charging guest students admission fees when their teams play as our opponents. Mr. Belknap explained the policy of the administration as follows: that in cases where reciprocal agreements regarding charges have been made between schools, no charges are necessary; otherwise an admission fee must be charged.

The Chair announced that he would have information concerning the gymnasium at the next meeting.

EMBLEM

Dick Nally asked Council what emblem ^{they} would approve for the school blazers. Bud Rusitsky will check whether or not the Art and Design Department is designing a new emblem before we make a decision.
