The minutes of the previous meeting were read, corrected, and approved.

SPRING WEEKEND

Bob Harris, Chariman of the Spring Weekend Committee, reported on the committee's progress and plans for the weekend of April 20, 21, and 22. His report included information concerning invitations to guests, tickets, decorations, advertising, etc.

BUDGET COMMITTEE

Frank Kowalski reported that the Budget Committee met last Thursday and discussed the following.

1. A new filing cabinet and desk lamp for the Student Association office for \$85.00.

The motion was made and passed by Council that they be purchased.

2. Reimbursement to Barbara Brill for expenditures made on a trip to New York for the second Olympic tryouts.

The motion that Council appropriate \$81.75 to Barbara Brill on recommendation of the Budget Committee was made and discussion followed. The motion was defeated. A new motion that the original request by Barbara Brill of \$110.00 be allotted was made and carried.

The Budget Committee will submit a quarterly budget report at the next Council meeting through which they will explain approximately where Student Association funds have been spent to date.

By April 16, all tentative 1956-57 budgets should be submitted to the Committee by the various organizations which the Student Association supports. The Committee expects to submit these to Council on May 14.

The suggestion was made that in the future Council be informed at all times as to what is under consideration by the Budget Committee. At the present the Committee is considering payments owed to the referees for the intramural basketball games and a backdrop for the gymnasium.

ASSEMBLIES

The assembly featuring Mr. Seldey as speaker is scheduled to be held on April 11, at 9 A.M.

TECHMILA

At the present time, nearly all copy for the Techmila is at the printers. The book is expected to be issued May 26.

BANQUET

The annual Student Council Banquet will be held May 15, Tuesday evening, at the Crescent Beach Hotel; Bud Rusitzky reported that the menu will be presented in three weeks for Council's selection.

BLAZERS

Carol Comparato reported that the new emblem chosen by the Institute is being used for the blazers. A representative of the Brooks-Allen Company will be at school Thursday, March 22, from 11 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. in Clark Union, Room 100, to take orders. A minimum deposit fee of \$5.00 is required and delivery will take from six to eight weeks. Since Council
