DIVISION REPORTS

CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

Council passed a motion by Bob Moore that Student Council go on record as being dissatisfied with the failure of faculty to read assembly notices to students.

Student Association cards are ready for distribution. A suggestion was made that they be put in student mail folders. There are extra cards available for husbands or wives of married students which will admit them to activities; however, they will not receive a Techmills.

Volunteers are needed to proofread printer's copies of the Student Directory.

ORGANIZATIONAL AFFAIRS

Bruce Fredericks thanked all those who had cooperated in making the Leadership Conference a success. There are plans to hold a second one later in the school year.

SOCIAL DIVISION

The meeting to schedule the winter quarter social calendar will be held tonight, October 19.

The new student chaperon system was explained. All scheduled events must now have a student chaperon in attendance at the function. Those eligible to serve as chaperons are the Student Council officers and members and officers of registered organizations on campus.

Council passed a resolution that all events deemed to be organized mixed group activities must be registered with the Social Division. Violations of same may result in group or individual social probation.
