STUDENT COUNCIL MEETING

January 11, 1962

The meeting was called to order by the president at 6:10 p.m. A standing roll was taken to give new members an opportunity to become acquainted. Old members were asked to brief the newer ones on Council procedures.

DIVISION REPORTS

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

Election results were announced. Those who had not had their pictures taken for the Technila were asked to report to the Clark Building after the meeting.

A list of Council's accomplishments during the last quarter will be published as a summary.

CAMPUS AFFAIRS

Parking stickers have been sold. There are still approximately 100 left which may be purchased Monday noon at the Student Union. The lots are now being checked. A department trophy for the Blood Drive will be awarded with donors receiving automatic credit for their department. They will also receive one point for the organization of their choice. The department trophy will be based on percentage, the organization award on number only. Members were asked to pick up donor blanks after the meeting.

Harry Winters presented an explanation of parliamentary procedure.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

HOCKEY

Of 128 colleges contacted in a survey, we have received 102 replies. Thirty of these have hockey teams, 25 of which are intercollegiate. The expenses less ice costs and coaches were itemized.

We do not now pay a coach. Our problem is one of finding time for practice. Most of the existing teams are located in the New England area which would increase transportation expenses. Attendance at our own games was reported as good at times when advertising was good. A motion was made that the committee reconvene to secure more information from the Athletic Committee and also comparative costs of other sports. The motion was withdrawn and the committee was so directed by the president.

BUSINESS

A motion to withdraw the WITR motion from the table was carried. Since WITR had no objection, Council passed the motion that the office of radio station WITR be removed from that organization's use and reverted to use as a regular Student Union Meeting room, open to any organization on campus.

Technila, represented by Herb Johnson gave its report. This year's yearbook will contain approximately 300 pages and cost \$21,850. It was noted that lack of workers may be caused by lack of recognition and prestige.

All notices posted on bulletin boards must be placed on 4 x 5 cards or they will be taken down. Organizations are requested to use 8-1/2 x 11 unless advertising a large event.

The announcement was made that an individual had been found to have violated the motion concerning mixed group activities. A recommendation was made for social probation with the recommendation of suspension of this penalty in view of the circumstances. It was conceded that both Council and the administration have a right to make regulations along with their responsibility for the student's welfare.

Don requested aid from all those interested in working on the budget.

There will be a student council work party after the meeting January 18.

The meeting was adjourned.
