STUDENT COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
January 25, 1962

The meeting was called to order at 6:10 p.m. Roll call was taken.

DIVISION REPORTS

SOCIAL DIVISION

George Murray was appointed Social Division Head for the remainder of the quarter. Bill Ferguson was appointed Spring Weekend chairman. The committee is looking for suggestions for Sunday night's entertainment. Saturday afternoon will feature an open school picnic.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

The Budget Committee has formed three evaluation committees for work on the budgets. A motion that Student Council accept the additional budget request of RAA in the amount of \$400 was passed. This additional allocation will be used to sponsor a dance for Brotherhood Week on February 17. Council also passed a motion that WITR be granted \$136.02 allocation, contingent upon their submitting to us an anticipated budget for the coming year. Budget meetings are held Tuesday evenings at 8:30 p.m. in the Student Union, anyone may attend.

CAMPUS AFFAIRS

A report on Parents Weekend was given. Income was \$1526.23; expenses were \$2013.89. A record of 216 donated for the Blood Drive. A motion that Student Council fine each student \$5 who has not reregistered his car with the Student Association office by February 12 was passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

STUDENT UNION

Three rooms have been completed. Organizations are now being scheduled to work during their meeting hour.

HOCKEY

Terry Sholley moved that whereas the students of RIT desire to have an intercollegiate hockey team and that the expenditure of our rink conversion to accommodate hockey will be nominal, that Student Council designate from its surplus fund the sum of 50 per cent of the total cost, up to a maximum of \$1,500, to defray the cost for conversion. After the defeat of a motion to table, the main motion was passed. Student Council tabled a motion to transfer \$2 from the present Student Association fee to the Athletic Fee for the purpose of financially supporting an Intercollegiate Hockey Team until representatives could consult their constituents.

BUSINESS

Barry Winters presented a further explanation of parliamentary procedure.

The president read the open letter from the Executive Committee. A motion was carried to add married students to the list of those on which we are requesting information on the scope of the Administration's authority. It was also moved and passed that this letter become a part of Council's minutes and be circulated to the student body to explain the situation and make them aware of the problem. The motion which reads "All events deemed to be organized mixed group activities must be registered with

the Social Division; violations of same may result in group or individual social probation" be revoked. A motion that proposals listed by Dave Wrobel be instituted during the interim period until the Administration makes clear its policies was defeated after debate was limited to five minutes. The present social calendar and rules regarding it will, however remain in effect.

A motion was passed to call an Inter-Organization Council meeting for next Monday at 7:00 p.m. in the Student Union to consider the proposals.

Al Shepard gave a report from the Hockey Club. The next organization to report will be the International Students.

Al Shepard announced that he was forming a committee seeking to improve the housing facilities for married students and welcomes the participation of anyone interested.

Darnell Mitchell was introduced as the new representative from the Photography Department.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
