Student Council Minutes
March 7, 1949

The publication of these minutes is a new policy of Student Council, intended to keep the members of the Student Association posted on the current issues being handled by their Student Council. These minutes will be published weekly and will be available at key positions throughout the school such as the desk at Clark Union, the library and Gleason Hall. The meeting was called to order at 5:08 P.M. by President Short. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Eugene Penler reported on the ping pong situation in the Clark building. A rack for the ping pong balls will be established this week. The janitors will collect the ping pong balls at 5:00 P.M. and will replace them on the rack at 8:00 A.M. This is to cut down on the loss of the equipment.

Golf club lessons are to begin next week. Lessons will be \$3.50 per student. Council will pay for part of this. Approximately 30 students have signed for the golf club.

President Short announced that nothing new has developed on baseball, but the administration is backing the idea. The coaching staff is the leading issue to-date.

Miss Medden explained the telephone situation. It is impossible to add any more phones to the main switchboard. Sprit, Techmila, and Council would need phones. This would run Council about \$360.00 per year. Discussion followed. Miss Medden is going to get Council a more exact estimate concerning this.

Miss Medden mentioned the conditions of the smoking lounges in the Clark and Eastman buildings. They must be better treated. Council members were asked to visit both lounges some time this week to get a clear picture of the situation. The discussion will be continued in next week's meeting.

President Short announced that Natalia Paulus is the new representative for N.S.A.

Emil Silvestri, editor of the 1949-50 Student handbook has asked that Council members look over last year's handbook and submit any changes at the next Council meeting. The new handbook will contain the Student Association constitution.

Irv Dolinsky, Clark Union House Chairman, reported on Clark Union. Council representatives are to post lists for those who have mail at the desk in the Union.

Some of the furniture is being repaired. Decorating for the Carnegie Room is in progress. The Alumni Association has the estimate for magazines for the Union.
