

# STUDENT COUNCIL MINUTES

May 2, 1949

The meeting was called to order by President Ben Short at 5:10 P.M. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

President Short extended his gratitude and thanks to all those who helped make the dance a success.

Eugene Penler, chairman of Student Council elections for next year, announced that the nominations will be held this week and elections next week.

The Student Council banquet will be held Tuesday, May 10 at the Spring House. All money must be in by Friday, May 6, so reservations can be made.

There is a shortage of tables and chairs in the Clark Building lounge. New furniture will be put there when the lounge is re-decorated next year.

Irv Dolinsky reported on the roller skating party. He has arranged for chaperones. It will be Friday May 13. Admission will be \$.35 per person. The motion was made that Council sponsor the roller skating party. It was seconded and carried.

Ed Posner reported on the parking lot repairs. It was suggested that an estimate be obtained for resurfacing rather than for repairing the lot almost every five months. Discussion followed. The estimates are rather high. Mr. Posner is going to get more data on estimates.

Eugene Penler asked about a suggestion box for the whole school similar to the one Sprit has. Discussion followed. Students are well represented on Council. Irv Dolinsky made the motion that the idea as presented by Mr. Penler be discarded. It was seconded but not carried. Mr. Dolinsky's motion was dropped. The motion was made that Council adopt the suggestion box idea. It was seconded and carried. Mr. Penler is going to take charge of this.

Eugene Penler asked if the cafeteria couldn't be used as a coffee shop from 8 to 10:30 A.M. and from 1 to 3 P.M. Discussion followed. Irv Dolinsky reported that the cafeteria is in use at those times. Miss Medden suggested a coffee machine in the Eastman lounge. This idea has been brought up before and because of general usage, the idea of food in the lounges had to be vetoed. Mr. Penler is going to check into the use of the cafeteria. Louis Gup asked if the Techmila office couldn't be moved and that space made into a coffee shop. There is no other place for the office to move. Irv Dolinsky made the motion that the idea of a coffee dispenser be discarded for the rest of this year, and a memo left for next year's Council. It was seconded and carried.

Ed Posner brought up the idea of a stop light at the corner of Spring Street and Plymouth Avenue. Discussion followed. This same idea has been discussed before. A motion was made that a letter be sent to the Rochester Safety Committee concerning this with Student Council backing. It was seconded and carried. The situation will be discussed with Dr. Ellingson and a copy of the letter will be sent to the alderman of this ward.

Irv Dolinsky announced that several magazines which are gift subscriptions from the Alumnae Association are in Clark Union.

As yet, no financial report on the Spring Carnival has been completed to give to Council because of outstanding bills. A report will be made in the near future.

A motion was made that the meeting be adjourned. Meeting was adjourned at 6:00 P.M.
