Student Council Minutes  
October 10, 1949

The meeting was called to order at 5:05 P.M. by President Joe Loughlin. Roll was taken. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

President Loughlin welcomed new Council members and requested that each new member acquaint himself with the Constitution and Parliamentary Procedure.

The Student Lounge Committee submitted its findings and recommendations in the case of Ronald Ketchum, a student charged with violating the house rules of Clark Union. After discussion, the Council decided that the original recommendation of the Committee of one month's suspension be reduced to two weeks. Clarence Matthews made the motion that Ronald Ketchum be suspended from the use of Clark Union for two weeks, and that any further violations of this sort be submitted to an investigation committee in order that more immediate action may be taken.

President Loughlin announced that we have received an estimate from one printer for the publication of the Student Directory, and it should be decided whether or not we shall have this book printed. After discussing this issue Ed Posner made a motion that we publish the Directory since money has been allocated for the purpose. Motion was seconded and carried.

Gene Penler was then called on to give the report of the National Student Association Convention. Mr. Penler explained the function of N.S.A. and its organization and what actions were taken at the convention which effected R.I.T.

A motion was made that we accept the Budget appropriation (\$390.00) for N.S.A. Seconded. After a discussion the motion was carried. The next N.S.A. Convention will be held in Syracuse this coming week-end (October 14.) A motion was made that four delegates be sent from R.I.T. to this convention. Seconded and carried.

Mrs. Robson read a statement from Mr. Davis concerning an Associate College Press Convention to be held in Detroit. A motion was made that we allot money to send a delegate to this convention. Seconded. Tom Nanka will be the delegate since he is editor of the 1949-50 Technilla. Motion was carried.

President Loughlin requested a member from each department to work on the Student Directory booklet. A meeting will be held in Council office Wednesday, October 12, 1949, at 12:30 P.M.
