Student Council Minutes
January 9, 1950

The meeting was called to order at 5:04 P.M. by President Joe Loughlin. Roll call was taken. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The chairman announced a meeting of the Budget Committee on Tuesday, January 10, at 12:30 P.M. in Student Council office. A meeting of the Constitution Committee is scheduled for Wednesday at 4:00 P.M.

The chairman then gave the floor to Gene Penler, N.S.A. senior member. Gene Penler asked permission of Council to install the Purchase Card System which would be of great benefit to all students in Rochester. Mr. Penler explained in detail the function of this system and the benefits received. If 15 or more stores are contracted, the N.S.A. committee will sell cards to students for \$1.00, allowing the students discounts at those stores. Mimeographed lists of all merchants allotting discounts will be given to students with the purchase of the card. This card will be honored anywhere in the U.S. where this system is in installation. Larry Weinberger made a motion that N.S.A. be allowed to canvass local merchants and contract for the purchase card system. Motion was seconded. Carried.

Copies of the Constitution were to be mimeographed and distributed to Council members, but it was decided that all students should see a copy of the proposed Constitution, as it is for their benefit. A special issue of SPRIT is expected to be printed next week, containing the Constitution and editorials concerning it. Students will be urged to contact their Student Council representatives to state their opinions and ideas concerning the Constitution.

George Emminger, editor of the Student Directory, had reported to the Direct president that proofs had been corrected last week and the Directory is expected to be completed at the end of this week.

Discussion followed as to the distribution of the Directory. It was decided that a student from each department should distribute the directory. President Loughlin asked for volunteers. Those volunteering were:
