ATTACHED YOU WILL FIND A COPY OF THIS YEARS ALLOCATIONS TO YOUR ORGANIZATION, (AND ALL OTHER RECEIVING FUNDS FROM COUNCIL.)

OF

ITS PURPOSE IS TO INFORM YOU THE AMOUNT OF MONEY YOU HAVE AND TO GIVE YOU AN OVERALL PICTURE OF STUDENT GOVERNMENT FINANCES.

ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 2/16, 1962 AT 8:15 IN THE STUDENT UNION, THERE WILL BE A LEETING FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXPLAINING A BOOKKEEPING SYSTEM WHICH EACH ORGANIZATION WILL BE REQUIRED TO EMPLOY IN MANAGING THEIR FINANCES. ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM RACE OF THE ORGANIZATIONS RECEIVING COURCEL FUNDS IS REQUIRED TO ATTEND THIS MEETING. FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN THE CLOSING OF THAT ORGANIZATIONS ACCOUNT.

The system to be explained is relatively simple, and the meeting should be fairly short. It is suggested that you send your present financial officer to this meeting. If you do not have such a person the president should attend and be prepared to name an individual who will assume the duties of financial officer. This year your books and accounts will be audited at intervals and if matters are found unsatisfactory your accounts may be suspended.

We are sorry for this which may seem an inconvenience to you but we are in a position in which we find it absolutely necessary to set up a rigid, standardized bookkeeping system not only for the various organizations but for Council Itself. In effect this should benefit everyone. You will learn something about keeping books, You will find it easier to prepare your proposed budget for subsequent years. You will also be able to tell exactly how much money you have on hand at any given moment etc. The accounting office will be able to keep better records and student government will be able to get a rapid, accurate and complete picture of the total Student Association financial picture.

IT SHOULD BE POINTED OUT THAT PART OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEES & RESPONSIBILITY LIES IN THE AREA OF ADVISING OR HELPING IN OTHER WAYS THOSE ORGANIZATIONS WHICH MAY FINANCIAL PROBLEMS OR QUESTIONS. IN THIS RESPECT THE INTERNAL AFFAIRS DIVISION HEAD (AND BUDGET COLMITTEE CHAIRMAN) WILL BE AVAIABLE FOR SUCH PURPOSES EVERY WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON FROM #3 - 5:30 in the STUDENT UNION (STUDENT COUNCIL OFFICES) DURING FALL QUARTER. IT IS HOPED THAT THOSE GROUPS WHICH ARE SEEKING ANSWERS TO MONEY PROBLEMS WILL TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THIS.
