Retreat - Upon completion, a written resume (now ts and slts) will be distributed. Dr. Campbell gave the key note speech to the 14 representatives who attended. The following is the re-written Preamble of our Constitution-

reproposed
We the students of the Rochester Institute of Technology; desiring to enrich our education; to maintain academic freedom; to maintain student rights; to foster the recognition of the rights and responsibilities of students to humanity, the community, the Institute, and to ourselves; to raise the level of student cultural and interpersonal relationships; and to provide standards and policies for the student body; do hereby establish this Constitution of the Rochester Institute of Technology Student Association.

The Election Board of Controls will meet to draw up a slate of nominations. Anyone who has served on Council for one year, and has not been placed on the slate, may run for president or vice-president if he or she submits a petition with 100 signatures. Departmental representatives' petitions are due two weeks prior to the elections.

The Student Leadership Conference is March 13 at 50 Main Street West from 9:30-2:30. Dr. Campbell will be the key note speaker, addressing student government officers from Monroe Community College, Nazareth, Roberts' Westleyan, St. John Fisher, U. of A., and R.I.T.. The discussion leaders will be Larry Albertson, Dean Cameron (Assocat Dean of Students at the U. of R.), Gene Duprez, and Mr. Zakia.

Teaching Effectiveness - A faculty "pop quiz", compiled at the Retreat, has been read and accepted by Dr. Smith and Mr. Fram. A letter will be sent to Dr. Wilson regarding the in-effectiveness of the mass classes. A faculty evaluation sheet is now being considered. This committee is working in conjunction with the Faculty Council.

The presentation of the varsity awards will be taken up with the Athletic Committee.


The Student Personnel Staff recorded that Mr. Walls and Mr. Hoppe will try to "spear head" the administration to publish the Student Handbook.
