STUDENT COUNCIL MINUTES

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as corrected; Murray and Hedberg were excused from the previous meeting; the proposed preamble is being considered; and the Oratorical Contest will be held April 23.

DIVISION REPORTS

Social - Dean Crawford

Stemming from the recent Leadership Conference, the social representatives from the area colleges will meet to try to coordinate social programs.

Organizational Affairs - Lloyd Beard

The Constitution of RAA was accepted. Approximately 15 constitutions are needed for reapproving.

Internal Affairs - Don Lembeck

The Budget Committee will meet regularly on Mondays at 4PM. The budget will be presented the week after elections.

Retailing is considering a alternate representation system.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

A second Leadership Conference will be May 4, at 50 Main Street West with the hope of coordination the area's intercollegiate cultural, academic, and social programs. The meeting will be primarily for new officers "to pave the way for next year."

Public Relations - Miss Hartfelder of the Faculty Staff will meet with Denis Boquist to establish the aims and purposes of this committee.

Teaching Effectiveness - A proof letter, which will be sent to Dr. Wilson, has been written concerning certain aspects of suggestive improvement.

Summaries from the Retreat were distributed.

The Election Board of Controls has established an election schedule. Volunteers are needed to help with the election procedure. The nominations for President were Ron Sherman, Denis Kitchen, and Denis Boquist. Nominations for Vice President were Lloyd Beard, Angel Pilato, and Jack Dodgon. The qualifications for the various offices were reviewed.

Student Union - It was passed that \$760 be allocated to the Student Union Fund from the Student Council Contingency Fund in order that the Union may purchase necessary furnishings to establish an interorganizational office in meeting room #3.

It was moved and defeated to remove the motion concerning the purchasing of a color television for the Union.

New -

It was moved by Lloyd Beard and defeated, to change the qualifications for the officers of Student Council.

It was moved and tabled that Student Council purchase a new black and white television.

It was passed that Student Council require those organizations which are budgeted by Council, to present a summary of their activities since the inception of the full quarter.

The President presented, as proposed additions to the Constitution, the Student Association Philosophy and a Bill of Rights for the members of the Student Association. The Purpose of the Student Association was also presented as a proposed amendment to the Constitution. These were referred to the Parliamentarian.

Dan Hedberg and Jack Dodgon were elected respectfully to the divisions of Campus Activities and Publicity and Publications.


Mr. Zakia complemented the President and Vice-President on initiating the first Inter-collegiate cooperation on any level.
