SUBJECT: Techmila Budget

"Why should the Yearbook receive such a large share of the Student Association Budget?"

1. TECHMILA is the only tangible item that every student receives from their Student Association fee. Although it is true that there are no limits as to who can become members of various organizations, or who can attend sporting events, etc., many students do not have the time or interest to do so. However, every student receives a TECHMILA.
2. Public Relations factor - this book is distributed all over the United States as well as in many countries from which we have students. It does well to serve as an advertising piece for the Institute. In view of this, we feel that TECHMILA is a greater Public Relations factor than most elements on campus. TECHMILA should be thought of primarily as a publication of the Institute and not as an "organization" in the Institute.

To quote the REPORTER in their May 28, 1962 editorial.
"Even many of the high-school yearbooks published today have at least color photographs, and in some cases several of the other 'frills' that we enjoy here at RIT. We have for many years enjoyed the role of pacesetter in the production of a fine record of school life. Today, however, TECHMILA is fast becoming less and less the exception, and more and more the rule."

The problem facing YOU--representatives of the students-- is to either grant TECHMILA'S budget request or to reject or modify it. If the budget is approved, TECHMILA can remain one of the leading Yearbooks in the country. A Yearbook that other yearbook staffs continually request to use as a guide in planning their editions. If the request is rejected or modified, TECHMILA will become just another ordinary yearbook from just another ordinary school. Incorporating Schools of Photography, Printing and Art & Design, it would be a shame indeed--because of a budget cut--if students were not given the opportunity of creating one of the finest yearbooks in the country, a Yearbook that you could be proud of and that would ultimately reflect back on RIT and its 2,200 students.

3. TECHMILA is of great value to students in the years to come. When they have forgotten names, events, etc., what better reference is there than the Yearbook, which is a complete record of the year's activities.
4. Students are interested in TECHMILA! From informal surveys made by the TECHMILA staff and from last year's Budget Committee's survey, it was found that students were in favor of a TECHMILA of top quality to rival any other college yearbook.
5. The allocation of funds from Student Council has been figured very close this year. It should be noted that there is no request for a salary for the staff paid out of Student Council funds. The request for salaries is basically the same as last years, paid out of excess advertising revenue, if any.

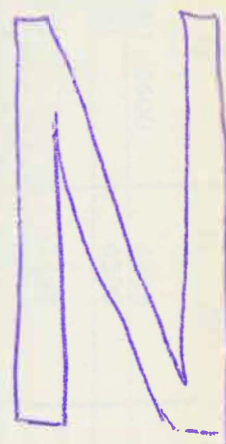

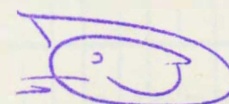
