It was moved and defeated that a committee be formed to study the conditions of this neighborhood.

It was moved that the Student Council send its expression of sympathy (vote of confidence) in a letter to the parents of the two fellows involved. It was moved and carried that the previous motion be amended to read that the letter which would be sent to the parents be first read and accepted by Dr. Campbell.

Motions to be presented to council meetings must be submitted in writing prior to the meeting.

The Student Council file is located in front of Eastman 125.

Department newsletters must be in the secretary's file by noon on the Tuesday following the council meeting. Failure to do so twice will count as a absence. Three absences a quarter result in expulsion from the council.

It was moved and withdrawn that all news-letters to be published in the following week should eliminate the discussion of the Parents' notes of sympathy sent to the parents of the deceased and the boys involved.

Bill Wing will write a small article for the REPORTER concerning the matter so that a universal presentation may be made. Russ requested that the subject be left out of the newsletters.

Dan McGillicuddy was nominated and elected Student Council Vice-president.

John Snyder was nominated and elected as the division head of Organizational Affairs.
