Student Council Minutes  
December 5, 1963

The regular meeting of the R.I.T. Student Council was called to order by the President, Ron Sherman. Roll call was taken and the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as corrected.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Representatives, investigate problems on campus for possible legislation or solutions.

A letter was received from the N.A.A.C.P. asking us to support the Civil Rights legislation by writing our local senators.

DIVISION REPORTS

The poster machine has arrived.


A pre-exam party will be held on Friday, December 13, from 2-5 p.m. in the Student Activities Center. FREE refreshments will be served.
